JAP (called JonDo in the scope of the new commercial service JonDonym - AN.ON remains free of charge) makes it possible to surf the internet anonymously and unobservably. Without Anonymization, every computer in the internet communicates using a traceable Address. That means: a) the website visited, b) the internet service provider (ISP), and c) any eavesdropper on the internet connection can determine which websites the user of a specific computer visits. Even the information which the user calls up can be intercepted and seen if encryption is not used. JAP uses a single static address which is shared by many JAP users. That way neither the visited website, nor an eavesdropper can determine which user visited which website. Instead of connecting directly to a webserver, users take a detour, connecting with encryption through several intermediaries, so-called Mixes. JAP uses a predetermined sequence for the mixes. Such a sequence of linked mixes is called a Mix Cascade. Users can choose between different mix cascades. Since many users use these intermediaries at the same time, the internet connection of any one single user is hidden among the connections of all the other users. No one, not anyone from outside, not any of the other users, not even the provider of the intermediary service can determine which connection belongs to which user. A relationship between a connection and its user could only be determined if all intermediaries worked together to sabotage the anonymization. The intermediaries (mix providers) are generally provided by independent institutions which officially declare, that they do not keep connection log files or exchange such data with other mix providers. JAP shows the identity and number of organisations in each Mix cascade in detail, and verifies this information by cryptographic means. The users are thus able to selectively choose trustable mix cascades. JAP is a software development within the Project Anonymity in the Internet sponsored by the German Research Foundation and the

Metadata Extraction Tool

The Metadata Extraction Tool was developed by the National Library of New Zealand to programmatically extract preservation metadata from a range of file formats like PDF documents, image files, sound files Microsoft office documents, and many others. The tool was initially developed in 2003 and released as open source software in 2007. The current version can be downloaded from the SourceForge download page. The Tool builds on the Library's work on digital preservation, and its logical preservation metadata schema. It is designed to: a) automatically extracts preservation-related metadata from digital files, and b) output that metadata in a standard format (XML) for use in preservation activities. The Tool was designed for preservation processes and activities, but can be used to for other tasks, such as the extraction of metadata for resource discovery. The Metadata Extract Tool includes a number of adapters that extract metadata from specific file types. Extractors are currently provided for: 1) Images: BMP, GIF, JPEG and TIFF, 2) Office documents: MS Word (version 2, 6), Word Perfect, Open Office (version 1), MS Works, MS Excel, MS PowerPoint, and PDF, 3) Audio and Video: WAV and MP3, and 4) Markup languages: HTML and XML. If a file type is unknown the tool applies a generic adapter, which extracts data that the host system 'knows' about any given file (such as size, filename, and date created). OSG provides help for new communities to adapt their applications to use the distributed facility and make their resources accessible. The OSG also works to enable scientists to seamlessly harness grid-computing resources worldwide and interoperates with multiple other Grid infrastructures. Therefore, combining our knowledge of gene expression and promoter control, improving gene and protein networks, and determining the role of signal transduction will enhance our ability to treat complex diseases. Systems biology is concerned with the integration of different levels of information to understand how complex biological systems function. By studying the relationships and interactions between various parts of a biological system (including gene and protein networks involved in cell signaling) it may be possible to create an understandable model of the whole system. Mathematical, analytic, and particularly computer simulation and heuristics are used as research methods.

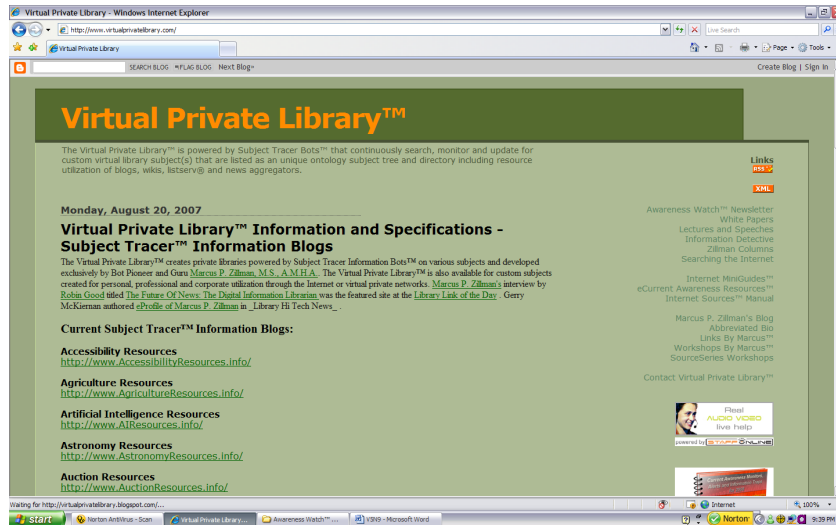
